I sometimes wonder how the members think the club runs, and how our amazing facility is managed and I would like to take this opportunity to remind everyone that the club is run totally by volunteers, a very small but dedicated group of people who give their time freely, and in some cases that is well over thirty hours a week to provide what is widely regarded as one of the finest sports clubs in the County.

The first team are sitting at their highest position ever and are at home to Oadby Town on Boxing Day 3pm kick off, so please try and get down to support the boys the bars and catering will be fully open.

It just leaves me to thank all of our Managers, Coaches, Trustees, Senior Section Directors, Club Administrators, Social Committee members, Scott, Elaine, Sean, Gary, Kez, Ivan, Joseph, Selena and everyone else who gives their time to the club for the work they have undertaken this year on behalf of the members, and to wish everyone connected to Harborough Town a very happy and peaceful Christmas and New Year.

Harborough Hornets Walking Football Team

Walking Football is a relatively new but fast growing team sport. Based on the rules of 5 a-side football, it is played by those now too old to play regular football and also encompasses those younger players that may be recovering from injury.

The team operates fully within the Harborough Town organisation and was formed in February 2015. The Hornets was chosen as a name because we needed a separate name with a bit of humour, almost mandatory in walking football it seems. Our parent clubs are known as The Bees, although technically a Hornet is an oversized wasp. Personally I love this definition from Wikipedia: European Hornet...... This species will sting in response to being stepped on or grabbed but generally avoids conflict.

We train weekly at 6.00pm on the 3G pitch at the club with Matt Wright, qualified coach at the club, taking each session. The session lasts an hour and comprises warm up and stretching exercises, ball work and concluding with a kick-about.

Although for many, being able to play football again rekindles the flame and the passion, you do not have to have played the game to participate. There can be no better way of keeping fit than by participating in an activity like this and it is a major contribution to the Health and Wellbeing of those attending.

The group now consists of about 10 regulars and a few casual attendees. We recognise that people have other commitments such as work, family, holidays etc so there is absolutely no pressure to attend each week: once the bug is caught though, then most strive their hardest to be there. We are fully inclusive so all ages, sex and abilities are welcome.

Our aim is to have two groups to cater for the 50+ and the 60+ and our key objective is to achieve this over the next 6 months. Although we have started to play friendlies against local teams, there is absolutely no obligation to play in these and some choose not to.

We are the first team to be entered in a National Competition in 2016 and are to be the featured Club of the year on the Walking Football United Website. On Saturday 12th December we visited Doncaster Rovers to play the Retro Rovers (great name) and played them on one of their 3G academy pitches, winning 3-1: we lost 6-5 however on a penalty shoot-out. We were scheduled to play walking football at Half Time, I believe the first ever occurrence at a Football League game, however torrential rain prevented this happening. We are to be invited back in the New Year to undertake the demonstration of Walking Football I understand. Two pages of The Donny programme against Crewe Alexandra were dedicated to Walking Football and included a message from our Chairman, Laurence Jones.

To promote ourselves we have been on HFM and, by the time you read this, we should have had a write up in the Harborough Mail, and an interview on BBC Radio Leicester non-league show (22nd December).
