Dear Member

Welcome to the second edition of the club newsletter

I thought this month I would try and share my views as to what the future could look like for the football club.

From the outside looking with forty teams and a fantastic facility I guess the perception is of a vibrant successful football club, but the reality is that Harborough Town are no different than any other grassroots football club, and one could argue that through the size of the club the challenges are that much bigger.

My view as Chairman is that the club should have a common identity across all of our activities and teams and that we provide a player pathway from five to sixty five. The first team currently play five leagues below the Football League, and the ambition has to be that we develop and educate Harborough players from the moment they join the club by providing the right opportunities so that when they reach seventeen they are ready to challenge for first team opportunities, and that we have a first team full of Harborough players who have come through the club system that can successfully compete at the higher levels of the game.

The club is blessed with a wonderful group of coaches and managers who give their time freely, we need to invest in our coaches and managers and for them to feel valued in the roles that they play. We speak about a player pathway, but to enable this we need to build a pathway for coaches, as exists in many other similar clubs across the country.

A football club needs to be the hub of the local community, a focal point not just for football but a place where people meet socially and have fun. The club as a whole has failed to deliver this and collectively this something that everyone connected to the club can help to change, by supporting club events and activities.

As Chairman I do not think the current financial structures and practices work, and these need to be reviewed so that the cost of playing football which is why we are all involved is kept to the minimum and is comparable to other clubs with similar facilities.

The club is run by volunteers who give their time freely, and for some that is a huge commitment almost a fulltime job. That cannot be sustainable for volunteers and we need more people to step forward to work as administrators, arrange social events, and help drive the club forward. People are often reticent of volunteering because of the volume of work involved, even if you can only spare a couple of hours a week that would be of such valuable assistance, and as we go the band of volunteers to run the club this will increase the sense of ownership and desire to be involved.

If I turn my thoughts to the facility, we need to find a way to maximise the potential of the amazing grassing football facility. One of the biggest complaints that I field is that the club facilities are not open at a time when members want to use them which primarily evenings and at weekends. As a club we have to address this issue and find a way that will enable the club to be fully operational during day for commercial activities and in the evenings and at weekends for club members

By far the biggest challenge of any grassroots football club is finance, and Harborough Town is no different. Since the opening of the new facility and the coming together of in effect three separate clubs the financial challenges have been immense. The reality is that despite the very best efforts and huge commitment from many people the club has struggled to run as a business. If the club is to survive and prosper on and off the pitch this has to change going forward. A new structure has to be embraced, the club needs to become far more commercially minded in how the facility is marketed, and how we communicate within our membership and more importantly externally to the outside world.

As Chairman my view is that the club is at a crossroads, if we do not change the way we operate then I am not that the club in its present guise is sustainable in the long term, or we can take a leap of faith embrace the pool of talent and knowledge that exists across the club membership and start building a football club for the future, that is vibrant successful and a real hub for the local community.

I hope for the long term future of Harborough Town my thoughts will encourage club members to step forward and be part of an exciting future, as without people my vision for the club cannot succeed.

As this is the final newsletter before Christmas can I thank who has committed so much to the club during 2014 for your amazing efforts, without each and everyone of you there would not be a football club, and as we look into 2015 there is a huge opportunity to build something very special for Market Harborough.
