On the Spot!

Each month we'll put someone on the spot with deep, meaningful questions. This month it's the turn of Ben Ward coach of the U16's.

Ben writes...

The current Harborough Town U16's, started life as HTFC Minis, training in Robert Smyth Sports Hall as U6's with Andy Bott in 2004. The team became HTFC Regals U7's in its first season of competitive football and 10 boys started on the journey, with Ben Ward and Dean Barnett as the coaches. The boys played 7 a-side football in division 1 from U7's to U10's, until they became u11's and then moved straight into 11 a-side football as U11's, dropping their "Regals" name.

The U11's and U12's seasons were great, as the boys won back-to-back County Cup Finals, and got through to 2 League Cup Semi-Finals and also won "Harborough Mail Junior Sports Team of the Year". As U14's the boys reached the League Cup Final played at HTFC, but unfortunately lost the final. 5 of

the boys have been with the team since we started out, and a further 5 have been with us since U11's.

This season, as U16's, has so far been a great success, having only lost 1 match to date from 15 played, and reaching our 3rd County Cup Final in 6 years. We have also reached the League Cup Semi-Final, and hopefully we will be fortunate enough to progress to the Final of this competition as well. The boys are a pleasure to coach and manage, and their success over the years has been built on a great team spirit and brilliant hard work ethic.

What is your involvement at HTFC?

I have been involved with HTFC since my twin boys started training at Robert Smyth School as 5 year olds, with HTFC Minis in the sports hall with Andy Bott coaching them. That makes it 11 years as a coach and manager of the team who are now HTFC U16's.

Who are your favourite team? HTFC U16's.

Who's your favourite player? My twin boys.

What's your most memorable footballing moment?

Winning back-to-back County Cups as U11's and U12's with the boys at Holmes Park.

Describe the way you like football to be played in 10 words or less: Passing and movement, with the ball on the

ground playing through the thirds.

What's the best thing about HTFC?

Working with the players in the squad, using the best facilities in Leicestershire.

Who are the best and worst players in your team, and why?

All of my players are equals, and are treated as such. There is no doubt that some are better at some things than others and vice versa, but on the whole, I am lucky to be able to coach a very talented group of players who all have a great attitude, and all contribute in every training session and match we play.
