#### Club Shop

The club shop has received fantastic feedback and massive thanks to the Social Committee in particular Phil and Jayne for bringing the shop to life. The club has worked hard to become a Nike Partner Club and the relationship we have with Nike and MDH is very important to the club.



#### **Members Bar**

The Trustees have been successful in being awarded a grant from the Mick George Community Fund which will be used to refurbish the members bar, install new lighting and CCTV at the club and to build a dedicated physio room. These works will be undertaken during the summer and the new members bar will be open for the start of the new season.

#### **Bar and Catering**

The bar and catering continues to grow under the leadership of Maz, and the trustees and social committee are looking at ways to see how we can provide an additional outlet to ensure that we can continue to provide a high quality service as demand

continues to grow. One of the options we are exploring is a mobile catering van which will allow greater flexibility across our facility.



#### **New Stand**

The club has purchased a new stand which will provide covered accommodation for 100 persons. The stand will be installed very soon. The cost of the stand was funded by the Football Foundation funding, the Social Committee and funds raised from the Craig Robinson Memorial Competition.

#### Car Parking



The Council having remarked the council car park and are now taking a very proactive approach to ensuring that cars are parked legally. Over the last few weeks a number of traffic wardens have visited the car park on Sundays and have issued tickets. We all know that parking is a very real challenge on busy

The Trustees would like to thank everybody who is ensuring the clean boot policy is adhered to on the new pitch, your efforts are appreciated.

Unfortunately, we still have too many instances when visiting players, managers and coaches and even some of our members have boots that do not conform or are dirty and have mud on them.

It is imperative that all visiting teams are sent the information that confirms what footwear can

and cannot be worn on the new pitch and it is the responsibility of the HTFC team manager to ensure that all players and coaches of both sides conform with the club regulations.



The reason for the requirement is that mud can contaminate the pitch which will shorten the life cycle of the pitch. Having spent £1million in providing the new pitch and ground we all must take

responsibility for looking after it, and the Trustees will continue to adopt a very rigorous approach to this and we need your help to ensure all users wear the correct footwear.

#### Old Artificial Pitch

The club is faced with renewing the pitch on the old 3G in the next eighteen months, the anticipated cost to undertake this work will be £350,000, this money we will have to raise in a very short time frame. The club will be launching an appeal across its membership and local community and will also be working hard to raise the funds needed, with statutory agencies.

There will be a number of club events which you are asked to support as the proceeds will go towards raising the sum needed to provide the new pitch.
