A message from Ivor McTighe, Youth Chairman

Dear members,

I do hope you, your family and friends are all staying safe and well in these unprecedented times. Of course everyone's well-being is the foremost and upmost importance to all of us and seeing our season prematurely brought to a close I know for many is disappointing, however with the increased nature of what we are all facing, this was not only inevitable but also the absolute right decision to make.

For all players the disappointment of not training and playing football is not lost on us at the club and I would like to thank Maz personally for the way in which she has sought to try to keep all players engaged with the challenges she has been setting — well done Maz and keep up the great work.

For a number of teams I also know the curtailment of the season will be bitterly disappointing where a number of our teams were in excellent shape to win or look to achieve runner-up places within the divisions they played in, and some also pushing for competition silverware having reached quarter-final and semi-final rounds. Also for our cohort of u18s who for many this was their last season of youth football.

Whilst we do have provisionally booked presentation dates in mid-June, it is highly likely that these will be delayed, but we will want to celebrate the season in some shape or form. We will keep you advised of dates when certainty is available to us.

As a family we do not know when we will be back into our loving home of the football club, but we do know the decision has been taken to cancel the grassroots season. For that reason, our pitch maintenance programme has been brought forward, including investment into new equipment to try to help drainage of the pitches which have suffered so much this season with the wet weather. I would like to thank Kez and Callum for their continued work and ensuring when we return that we present the pitches once again in fantastic order.

Rest assured when we can recommence training safely, we will be looking to do so, especially when we will see a number of trials needed for certain age groups, for example, the academy sides which we are seeking to grow for 20/21 season.

I am receiving some enquiries about player fees and how these will be handled. For now, I have suspended any outstanding payment collection for our new members who have recently joined. In addition, for a small number of existing players who have been with us all season, where payments are still being collected, including outstanding player fines, I have paused chasing of those. These do remain owing, however this is not the time to collect or chase for those monies.

For many teams, they would have normally concluded the season at the Easter break, with only a few returning thereafter. When we have greater visibility of our likely return to football, I will, together with my fellow trustees, consider how we approach the season 2020/21 fees as part of the renewal process and taking into account the shortened season we have had.

For now though stay safe and well with best wishes to you, your family and friends.

Spread the colour....


