SENIORS UPDATE

Now that we have received further guidelines from the FA and the Government around the return to football, including start dates for the new season in the National League System (which covers steps 1 to 6), we can finally start to prepare for friendlies and the start of the league season scheduled for 5th September 2020.

The club, I think we can all agree, has been fantastic in their approach to Covid-19 and the systems in place are superb and better than most at our level of football. A massive well done to Tomas Mikenas, Maz, Simon and all the staff at the club. You have done and are doing, a great job, keep it up!

With everything in such good shape around the club and all the necessary precautions and tests taking place, it leaves the managers and coaches time to concentrate on what they need to do, which is preparing their respective teams for the season opener. This year, with the delays we have all experienced, the league season commences on Saturday 5th September, but the actual opening game of the season will be on Tuesday 1st September when the first team will travel to Wellingborough Whitworth FC in the extra preliminary round of the Emirates FA Cup. Later in September the first team will host Barrow Town in the FA Vase competition.

With the plans all now in place we move onto pre-season and with the First and Reserve teams retaining the majority of their squads and adding 3 or 4 where needed to strengthen, both teams have returned to pre-season training where they will undoubtedly be dreading the tough 5 week schedule of fitness and games 3 times a week. We are still awaiting on the final list of friendlies scheduled for the Reserves, but the First team are underway, as below:

YOUTH UPDATE

The Sunday Youth Leagues felt it was really important that discussions took place across all leagues to form a consistent approach and they will be looking to carry on that approach in the coming weeks wherever possible. There is no doubt going forward that communication between all will be key to a successful restart and continuation of football. On the following page is a copy of their joint statement, which we believe is a very welcome and suitable approach to these unprecedented times:

The club has the following youth age groups playing in Sunday Juniors/Youth Leagues. Most of our Sunday youth teams will be effected by the delayed start to the opening games of the season. The Midland Junior Premier League (Saturday League) is still scheduled to commence on the 12th September. The Leicestershire Youth Midweek Floodlit League is still to confirm the start date of the season.

Harborough Town FC are competing in the following leagues:

- Leicester & District Mutual Football League: U7s U10s (mixed gender teams)
- Leicestershire Sunday Foxes Football League: U11s U12s (boys)
- * Leicester & District Sunday Juniors Football League: U13s U15s (boys)
- Leicestershire Youth League: U16s U18s (boys)
- * Leicestershire Youth Midweek Floodlit League: U18s only (boys)
- * Leicestershire Women and Girls Football League: U8s Open Age Women (girls only teams)
- Leicestershire Youth Futsal League (Saturday indoor futsal)
- * Leicestershire & Rutland Inclusive Football league: Provides football for individuals with differing impairments, playing together.

Of course, all plans are dependent upon lockdown being lifted and clubs being in a position to satisfactorily prepare for the start of the season both from a playing perspective but also facilities and everything Covid-19 related.

A JOINT STATEMENT FOR SUNDAY YOUTH FOOTBALL IN LEICESTERSHIRE & RUTLAND:

You will be aware of the recent Government statement regarding the restarting of competitive grassroots football and the subsequent advice and guidelines issued by the Football Association.

The Leicester District Mutual League, Leicestershire Foxes Sunday League, Leicestershire Women & Girls Football League, Leicester & District Sunday Juniors League, and the Leicestershire Youth League have met and can confirm we have taken the decision to commence our league seasons on Sunday 20th September.

We felt it was important to provide a definitive timeline to you as soon as possible and this of course is dependent upon the lockdown in Leicester / Oadby & Wigston being lifted within a reasonable time period. The slight delay in restarting is to allow all clubs in our leagues to be in a position to evenly prepare for the season ahead no matter where they are located.

Following feedback received from a number of clubs, it is also apparent that there are also still quite a few potential issues and uncertainty about availability of some facilities that need addressing, as well as clubs being able to internally prepare with the required adherence to guidelines.

As leagues we are totally aware of the need to work with all clubs and to make our approach as consistent as possible – hence this joint statement. Please continue to feedback any issues that may affect all or indeed single leagues.

We are all currently working on league affiliation to the FA and getting our Fulltime sites up and running. It will be our intention to publish initial fixtures by Sunday 16th August and for you to feedback and discuss with us any issues with those fixtures relating to such things as ground shares/capacity and kick off times by the end of August.

As with the original lockdown, this is an unprecedented situation & we would collectively like to thank all clubs for your understanding. It is really important there is good communication and an open approach to dialogue between us all going forward with us all working together.
